Dear Friends and Supporters,

Reflecting on 2024, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude for what we've accomplished at the Recovery Community Network (RCN) this past year. It has been a year of tremendous growth, impact, and change. **We have a new leadership team in place.** With the strong support of our team, partners, and community, we've expanded our services, increased outreach, and strengthened our commitment to every individual's recovery journey.

Our mission has always been to create a recovery-friendly community where everyone can access the resources, support, and opportunities needed to thrive. In 2024, we made this mission a reality in more ways than ever before. We increased our office hours to serve our peers better, expanded our staff to meet growing demands, and incorporated new funding strategies to enhance the sustainability of our services. These changes reflect our commitment to continuously improving the quality and availability of care.

Some of our key accomplishments this year include training 28 new Certified Peer Recovery Specialists (CPRS), growing our Telephonic Recovery Support to reach 284 peers each week, and providing over \$25,000 in critical financial support through Good Samaritan Grants and Peer Emergency Assistance. We also strengthened our presence in the community through outreach to treatment centers and law enforcement and expanded our harm reduction efforts, ensuring life-saving resources like Naloxone and Fentanyl test strips are readily available.

Additionally, our Justice-Involved Programs have seen remarkable growth, supporting veterans, engaging with transition fairs, and expanding our collaborations with local treatment courts. We are proud to have distributed 600 tickets through the Minnesota Twins Program this year, allowing more individuals and families to experience moments of joy and connection.

As we look ahead, our goal remains clear. The achievements outlined in this report are a testament to our community's strength, and we are excited to build on this foundation as we move into 2025. Thank you for your continued support and dedication to our shared mission.

The Recovery Community Network (RCN) is a grassroots Recovery Community Organization (RCO) founded in 2014. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, our mission is to deliver peer support, education, outreach, advocacy, and prevention strategies to individuals and family members struggling with substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders. We support all pathways to recovery and aim to improve the lives of underserved populations in rural St. Cloud and central Minnesota, including BIPOC, criminal justice-involved individuals, veterans, and other at-risk groups while building stronger, more resilient communities.

Our Impact in 2024



As the 2024 fiscal year comes to a close, RCN proudly reflects on a year of significant growth and impact. By expanding our services, fostering strong partnerships, and enhancing outreach, we've supported more peers than ever before on their recovery journeys.

With a dedicated focus on diverse recovery pathways, harm reduction, education, and justiceinvolved programs, we have risen to meet the evolving needs of our community, advancing our mission to empower individuals and families in achieving lasting recovery.

RCN Growth & Accomplishments

Expanded Operations:

- Expanded office hours from 40 to 45 per week.
- Increased total staff hours from 192 to 272.
- Raised operational budget from \$339,349.50 to \$464,374.80.
- Increased staff salary from \$210,051.40 to \$278,712.00.

Staffing & Volunteers:

- Hired 2 new grant-funded staff and 3 staff paid through Medicaid billing.
- Integrated 3 full-time Recovery Corps Volunteers.

Recovery Support:

- Hosted 2 FREE Recovery Coach Academies (RCA), training 28 peers to become Certified Peer Recovery Specialists (CPRS).
- Joined the local Chamber of Commerce.
- Increased peers reached weekly via Telephonic Recovery Support (TRS) from 130 to 284.
- Provided 111 peers with 1-on-1 recovery coaching, totaling 1,564 coaching sessions.
- Awarded \$15,920 in Good Samaritan Grants.
- Provided \$10,000 in Peer Emergency Assistance.
- Facilitated 10 weekly recovery meetings, including one Spanish-speaking AA meeting.
- Continued to support all pathways to recovery.
- Offered peer volunteer opportunities addressing housing, employment, education, insurance, and basic needs.

Our Impact in 2024

Education & Outreach:

- 1,248 outreach efforts to DETOX centers (M/W/F).
- Conducted monthly treatment center visits (8 hours/month), reaching 1,575 peers.
- Partnered with Centracare, NuWay, CMMHC, Momentum Center, Bridge Recovery, Project Turnabout, Effective Living Center, Partners Behavioral Health, Overcomers International Fellowship (OIF).
- Worked with St. Cloud Police Department (150 officers) and Stearns County Sheriff (35 officers briefed).
- Provided 156 service hours at Stearns County Jail and 24 service hours at Benton County Jail.

Agency Participation:

- Participated in Recovery Day on the Hill.
- Involved in Minnesota Recovery Connection (MRC) Walk for Recovery and Rockin' Recovery in the Park.
- Sean serves as a board member of MARCO.

Harm Reduction & Prevention:

- Launched a grant-funded Naloxone Storage Box Project at SCSU.
- Sean provided Harm Reduction Training.
- Free materials provided in the meeting room: Naloxone IM/Narcan Overdose Kits, Fentanyl Test Strips, Xylazine Test Strips, and condoms.
- Hosted 44 events in 2024, up from 26 in 2023.

Veteran & Justice Support:

- Participated in DOC Transition Fairs.
- Attended Mid-MN Transition Coalition Meetings.
- Supported 40 new veterans through the Veteran Program.
- Engaged with Veteran Treatment Court and hosted the 2nd Annual Veteran Retreat.
- Participated in MN Women Beyond the Yellow Ribbon Retreat and the Minnesota Twins Program (distributed 600 tickets, up by 250 from last year).


